



Dear Friends,

It is a privilege to serve as the president of the Strider Education Foundation board of directors, a 501(c)(3) nonprofit organization based out of Rapid City, South Dakota. Our primary focus is simple: to give every child in America the opportunity to learn how to ride a bike in school. We can do this with the All Kids Bike Learn-to-Ride Kindergarten PE Program. This simple, yet transformative goal, ensures all kids get to experience the quintessential childhood joy of riding a bike, while developing life-long skills that can foster a healthier, more active life.

The board is committed to effective governance to ensure that we stay true to our focus and 2022 was our most impactful year yet.

Our accomplishments in fiscal year 2022 included:

- Increasing the number of schools teaching kids how to ride by an additional 380 programs delivered in 2022.
- Impacting an additional 34,000 kids gaining the opportunity to learn to ride a bike in 2022.
- Receiving \$2.4 million for support of our mission while maintaining transparency and conservative spending of \$1.9 million, with only 4.4% going to management and general budget expenses, 6.4% to fundraising efforts and 89.2% spent directly for program expenses.

With our continued efforts we are happy to report we had a total of 824 programs running at the end of 2022 impacting over 100,000 kids on an annual basis and over one million kids over the lifespan of the program.

Though we cannot be certain what 2023 holds for us, we can be driven and purposeful to continue forward with our mission. We have a goal of implementing 500 programs in 2023. Our success depends on generous supporters who share our passion of imagining a better world for every child. Please consider donating to the Strider Education Foundation (aka All Kids Bike) in 2023. At any given time, we have 100 schools fundraising and eagerly waiting to start teaching kids how to ride a bike.

It warms my heart to hear what teachers say about the All Kids Bike Learn-to-Ride Kindergarten PE Program like this quote from Jennifer Busch-Dixner at Gardner International Magnet School, "Thanks to the All Kids Bike Program, our school will be one step closer to providing our kindergarten students with equitable access to the childhood rite of passage of riding a bike. The majority of our students do not have bikes at home, so given the opportunity to learn how to ride a bike at school, students will develop physically and mentally, giving them greater self-confidence. This physical exercise will also provide an excellent alternative for our students to reduce stress resulting in better focus and positively impacting their academic performance."



HOW WE CAN MAKE A DIFFERENCE

The All Kids Bike Learn-to-Ride Kindergarten PE Program provides a learn-to-ride opportunity packed with fun, gratification and success! Building upon a foundation of skills acquired in each lesson, students achieve milestones that guide them to the final goal of pedaling a bike independently.

Designed to be taught in 8 integrative lessons, the curriculum teaches kids the natural progression of learning to ride a bike. This program helps develop healthier and confident kids with an excitement for riding a bike.

This program, valued at \$18,849, gives schools everything needed to teach children how to ride a bike. Thanks to Strider Bike Company, we are able to offer this program to schools for a one-time donation of \$9,000. With a program lifespan of 7 to 10 years, this means 10 generations of kiddos will experience the joy of two wheels!



WHERE IT ALL BEGAN

Strider Education Foundation

The commitment to education from Strider Bike Company inspired Founder and CEO, Ryan McFarland, to ensure that every child has the opportunity to learn how to ride a bike. This led to the establishment of a nonprofit organization. In 2017, three individuals, including Ryan McFarland himself, were brought on as board members and obtained the nonprofit IRS 501(c)(3) status for the Foundation. The following year two more board members joined, and they initiated the All Kids Bike program. This program, supported by private donations and fundraising efforts, aims to introduce learn-to-ride programs in kindergarten physical education (PE) classes in schools nationwide. Each year, the program gains more recognition and credibility in revolutionizing PE curriculum. In 2021, our efforts resulted in an additional 184 schools implementing the bike-riding program, and we achieved the significant milestone of having the program running in all 50 states. Since our inception through 2022, we have proudly facilitated proactive bike education in PE classes for 824 schools.































ALL KIDS BIKE LEARN-TO-RIDE KINDERGARTEN PE PROGRAM ENHANCEMENT

WE HAVE BIG NEWS...

We are excited to announce an enhancement to our All Kids Bike Learn-to-Ride Kindergarten PE program! Since the beginning in 2018, when the All Kids Bike program was developed, we've received feedback from schools that storage was one of the biggest obstacles. Knowing this is such a concern, we decided to provide a solution and make it as easy as possible for schools to implement the program, maintain proper storage of the fleet, and teach kids to ride a bicycle. By providing better storage for the pedal kits, which are particularly susceptible to damage when not installed on the bicycles, we can help to ensure the program will last its 7-to-10 year lifespan. In addition to the proper storage solution, we also improved the teacher instructor bike to include a pedal kit attachment, so our rockstar educators can **truly** keep up with those kiddos!


The **enhanced** All Kids Bike Learn-to-Ride Kindergarten PE Program fleet includes:


- 24 (14 inch) balance bikes
- 24 pedal conversion kits
- 24 helmets
- 1 (20 inch) teacher instructor bike with the capability of converting to pedals just like the kiddos bikes
- 2 metal rolling storage racks that will hold all 24 bikes, helmets, and slots for the storage of the pedal conversion kits

With these enhancements, came a price increase to \$9,000 that became effective July 1, 2023. The price adjustment was mostly due to inflation, equipment cost, and increased shipping expenses. The Foundation was unable to continue to absorb these economic costs.

We will continue to provide the teacher portal which contains enhanced interactive curriculum videos, games and activities, and updated print materials for the classroom and continued support to give as many kids as possible the opportunity to learn to ride a bike in kindergarten PE class.

RYAN DUNGEY FOUNDATION



The Ryan Dungey Foundation, led by the 9-time AMA Supercross and Motocross Champion, Ryan Dungey, has generously donated nearly \$175,000 to All Kids Bike, enabling the Kindergarten PE Learn-to-Ride Program to reach 31 schools across the United States.

For Ryan Dungey, the thrill of riding a bike has been a source of immense joy and success throughout his life. From a young age, he discovered the sense of freedom and limitless possibilities that two wheels brought to his world.

The partnership between All Kids Bike and The Ryan Dungey Foundation began with the selection of 5 schools in communities that held significant meaning in Dungey's racing career. These locations ranged from his hometown to the venues where he achieved notable victories, including where he hosted his first event for his foundation.

28,000+ STUDENTS IMPACTED

IN 31 SCHOOLS THROUGHOUT THE LIFESPAN OF THE PROGRAM This initial momentum paved the way for expanding efforts to cities associated with Dungey's 9 championship wins. As the partnership grew, the focus shifted to encompass communities supported by passionate advocates and well-known industry-leading companies like Fox Racing and KTM. Together, they aim to create a lasting legacy in Motocross and Supercross cities across the United States, extending far beyond the racetracks and long after the dirt settles.



YAMAHA OAI

As of 2023, Yamaha has committed \$190,000 to All Kids Bike through its Yamaha Outdoor Access Initiative (OAI) grant, funding 28 school programs and impacting over 2,000 children on an annual basis, and over 20,000 throughout the lifespan of the program. As outdoor enthusiasts know, learning to ride a bike is not only a rite of passage, but a practical ability supporting a child into adulthood. The Kindergarten PE Program provides not only equity, but accessibility to all children, it is an inclusive and progressive program where students can learn at their own pace, and every child has the opportunity to look up with the biggest smile and say, "I DID IT!".

The collaboration between Yamaha and All Kids Bike began in 2021 when Yamaha OAI awarded the initiative a grant of \$30,000. Together, they successfully launched All Kids Bike Learn-to-Ride Kindergarten PE Programs in 6 elementary schools across Cypress, California, and Newnan and Marietta, Georgia, where Yamaha Motor Corp. USA employees are based. Witnessing the positive impact of their partnership, Yamaha further extended its support in 2022 by providing an additional grant of \$60,000. This enabled the activation of programs in various communities, including Atlanta, Georgia; Denver, Colorado; Charlotte, North Carolina; Crawfordsville, Indiana; Waverly, Tennessee; and Prather, California. Through these grants, Yamaha and All Kids Bike are significantly expanding their reach, ensuring that more children have the opportunity to engage in outdoor recreation and gain the numerous benefits associated with learning to ride a bike.

Yamaha strategically selected communities that have significant meaning to their organization. These communities encompass Yamaha dealerships, OEMs (Original Equipment Manufacturers), race destinations, and other cherished company resources. By linking the impact of the All Kids Bike program to these influential areas, Yamaha ensures a meaningful and interconnected approach to fostering positive change.













"Yamaha's support of All Kids Bike will get thousands of kids across the country outside, on bikes, and experiencing two-wheel adventures," said Steve Nessl, Yamaha's Motorsports Marketing Manager. 1000™ SCHOOL MILESTONE

All Kids Bike is excited to announce the activation of our 1,000th Learn-to-Ride Kindergarten PE Program at Geyser Road Elementary School, a Title I school in Saratoga Springs, N.Y. This achievement is not only a significant milestone for All Kids Bike, a program that started just over 4 years ago under the Strider Education Foundation, but also underscores our commitment to empowering every child in America with the joy and confidence of learning to ride a bike.

Geyser Road Elementary School was abuzz, as the 1,000th fleet of bikes was unveiled during a schoolwide assembly for their kindergarten students. "The transformative impact of learning to ride a bike cannot be overstated." Lisa Weyer, executive director of the Strider Education Foundation, reiterated this sentiment, saying, "Learning to ride is a life-changing experience for children. And thanks to the Saratoga Shredders, it's an experience that the students of Geyser Road Elementary will have. It's our mission to provide this opportunity, and our success to date would not be possible without the support of our major donor partners such as, Coca-Cola Consolidated, HDR, KEEN, The NASCAR

Weyer continued, "This is the 176th school to activate the All Kids Bike Learn-to-Ride Kindergarten PE Program in 2023, and with the help of Strider Sports International, which subsidizes more than half of the funding needed to bring the program to each school, we are striving to meet a landmark challenge of activating 500 schools in 2023. It's a big goal, but with the help of more donors big and small, it means nearly 40,000 kids will learn how to ride a bike, this year alone."

Reaching the 1,000th school milestone means we are teaching 100,000 kiddos how to ride a bike on an annual basis and impacting 1 million kids throughout the lifespan of the program.

"When kids learn how to ride a bike, the world opens up for them," remarked Weyer. "They absolutely light up. Riding builds independence, confidence, and fitness. However, most children don't have the opportunity to learn how to ride a bike on their own. All Kids Bike offers a solution to that unfortunate reality, and we are actively seeking partners to support our goal to bring this program to every kindergarten class in the country."




